ORLI ETINGIN, M.D. is the Lisa and Sanford B. Ehrenkranz Professor in Women's Health at Weill Cornell Medical College, Attending Physician at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, and Director of the Iris Cantor Women's Health Center at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center. She is a graduate of Johns Hopkins University, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, and the former New York Hospital medical residency and hematologyoncology fellowship program. During her fellowship, she worked in the laboratory of Dr. David Hajjar in vascular biology, examining cellular mechanisms of atherosclerosis and thrombosis. From 1992 until 1997, Dr. Etingin was Associate Chairman of the Department of Medicine, and until 2009, Vice Chairman.

Dr. Etingin was a clinician scientist until 1994 when she began clinical practice at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center in general internal medicine and hematology-oncology. In response to a recognized need for coordinated and integrated care, Dr. Etingin founded the Iris Cantor Women's Health Center in 2000, which became a multidisciplinary group of full-time physicians at the Medical Center. Since that time the Center has grown to be home to over 25 physicians. Dr. Etingin maintains her clinical practice at the Center, specializing in general internal medicine and coagulation disorders in pregnancy.

Dr. Etingin is a member of the American Medical Women's Association. She serves on several Hospital and Medical College committees including the Promotions and Review Committee for the Department of Medicine, and the Committee for Faculty Diversity. Dr. Etingin has been the medical consultant to the Medical Center's Women's Health Symposium since 1995. She is the editor of two nationally distributed newsletters, *Food and Fitness Advisor* and *Women's Health Advisor*. She has been named in *New York Magazine's* "Best Doctors" as well as Castle Connolly's *America's Top Doctors*. Dr. Etingin lives in New York with her husband, Dr. Jonathan Silver. They have three children, Elliot, Benjamin, and Leah, a daughter-in-law, Rebecca, and two grandsons (born January 30, 2013 at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital!).
