

Department of Medicine (PO) Work Relative Value Units





- *Funding*: two \$50,000 one-year research grants, starting 12/1/12.
- *Eligibility*: lead PI must be DoM faculty member.
- *Topics*: Novel, unfunded projects in basic, translational, or clinical biomedical research.
- Received 18 applications by the Sept 10 deadline.
- *Selection Process: ad hoc* committee of impartial experts will choose winning applications over the course of the next month.

DoM Grant Writing Assistance Program

- *Purpose*: help grant writers improve their "grantsmanship", focusing on writing and presentation.
- *Rationale*: for a relatively small departmental investment, we should be able to improve the grant hit rate.
- *Eligibility*: all DoM faculty submitting federal or foundation grant as lead PI.
- *Funding*: \$50,000 has been allocated; pilot stage will end when money is spent; program extension will depend on its efficacy.
- *How it works*: PI will work with a grant-writing consultant over the course of several weeks to improve the quality of the grant through discussion, editing, and re-writing. DoM will pay up to \$2250/PI, which will fund approximately 15 consultant hours.




